

Why we need Champions like you



In Australia today, 1 in 6 children and young people are living in poverty. This can have a devastating effect on a child's life.¹

Children living with disadvantage often lack the support and materials that should be available to every Australian child, and as a consequence, may fall behind in their learning. Your ongoing support helps remove these barriers that poverty puts in the way of their education.

Our out-of-school programs are proven to build a child's skills, boost their confidence, and help them stay motivated at school so they can unlock their full potential and access all the opportunities they deserve.

All children should have an equal chance to access educational support, regardless of their financial circumstances. Your generosity helps provide that support to children and young people living with disadvantage, so they can complete Year 12 and further their study or gain employment.

Learning Clubs: provide a safe and supportive out-of-school learning environment where students can access expertise and resources to help them with homework, numeracy and literacy.



student2student: an 18-week program that pairs students who are behind in their reading with trained buddies who work with them to build their skills and confidence.




SmArts: connects students in Years 8 to 12 who are interested in creative arts with organisations and professionals, so they can access valuable guidance about study and career pathways.

Research shows that keeping students in school longer is a highly effective way to help them break the cycle of poverty. Our programs give students the skills and knowledge to feel confident, participate in class and have a positive attitude towards school.

Short-term outcomes

Our programs help improve students' literacy, numeracy and ability to keep up in class. They also build aspirations and motivation to stay at school.

Long-term outcomes

Students complete Year 12 and go on to work, further education or training.

Ebonie wants to give her daughters the world - you are helping her do it

Ebonie loves to encourage her daughters Lilv and Holly to dream big! But as a single mother working full-time, Ebonie is chronically time poor. She's also experiencing financial hardship.

That's why Ebonie was thrilled that Lily and Holly could access the extra learning support all children need to succeed, thanks to you.

Lily has a warm personality and a way of looking out for others that is far beyond her years – and Ebonie wants to ensure that adversity does not hold her back. At one point, Lily was too shy to practice reading out loud in class, putting her at risk of falling behind. "With me working full-time, I find it difficult to make time to sit down and read the books with her, so she can get the extra practice," Ebonie says.

Thanks to your support, Lily and Holly were able to join our student2student and Learning Club programs.

Through the student2student program, Lily was matched with a peer buddy to read over the phone. These sessions helped Lily get that extra reading time she needed to feel confident to use her voice in class. "After a few sessions, Lily opened up and had a wonderful experience. Her reading has improved a lot – she's now at the same standard as the rest of her classmates," Ebonie says.

Ebonie is also delighted at the experiences Lily has at *Learning Club* where she gets extra maths practice with volunteer tutors. "Lily loves maths, and we've found that incorporating maths into cooking is really fun." Ebonie savs.

As Lily starts to prepare for high school, a laptop is a staple for homework and research. It worried Ebonie that she and the girls would have to rely on one old laptop between them which barely worked. She couldn't afford a new one.

Through the Digital Learning Essentials program, Lily was offered a refurbished laptop to help her keep up and thrive at school. Ebonie is so grateful that Lily can now have reliable access to opportunities her classmates have.

Every parent wants their child to set their sights high. With the learning support you help provide. Lily can now fully participate in learning and achieve all she aspires to and works so hard for.



Frequently asked questions

Q. When will my gifts be deducted?
