Ensuring children in need do not miss out

As the costs of living and education rise, we want to make sure that no child who we support is left behind because of their circumstances.

That's why we periodically review the cost of sponsorship against the rising costs of living. Right now, all Australian families are finding it harder to make ends meet, but it's especially difficult for those already struggling with financial hardship.

We consulted broadly with a large group of sponsors and families to help us determine a way forward for both sponsors and students. As a result of the combined feedback and support, the cost of sponsorship will be increasing effective 1st January 2025. As always, the entire increase will directly benefit your sponsored students across the three pillars of support that sponsorship provides.

Changes to the cost of sponsorship

We aim to ensure that your students can access the school essentials and extra learning support they need to flourish. So, today, we ask your Club if you could please continue supporting at the new cost of sponsorship outlined below.

Where do my sponsorship donations go?

Your sponsorship donations go directly towards ensuring your sponsored student gets the full benefit of our **Learning for Life** program – helping students experiencing disadvantage to make the most of their education. Here's what your sponsorship provides:

- 1. **Financial support** enabling the family to afford education essentials for your sponsored student for things like uniforms, shoes, stationery, textbooks and excursions, and coursework for older students;
- 2. **Personal support** matching a Learning for Life Co-ordinator with the family for the duration of your student's sponsorship. They work closely with the family to provide tailored support for your student, including linking them to the educational programs we offer;
- 3. **Program support** where needed, your sponsored student can attend our out-of-school learning and mentoring programs.
