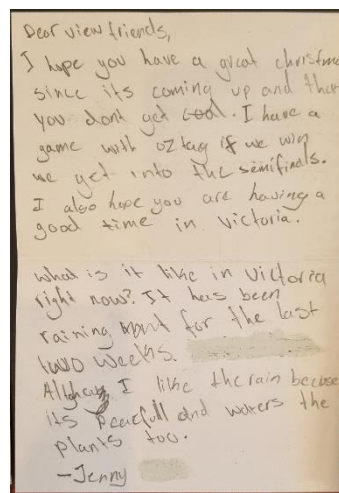
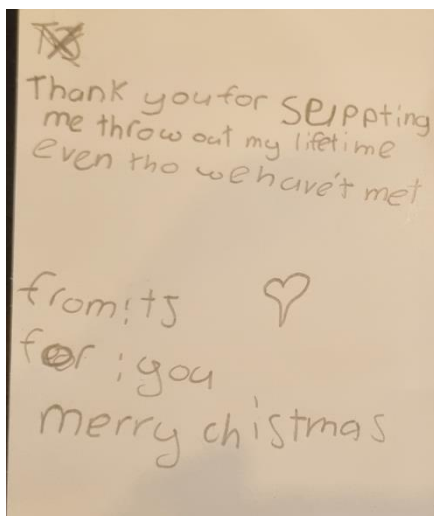
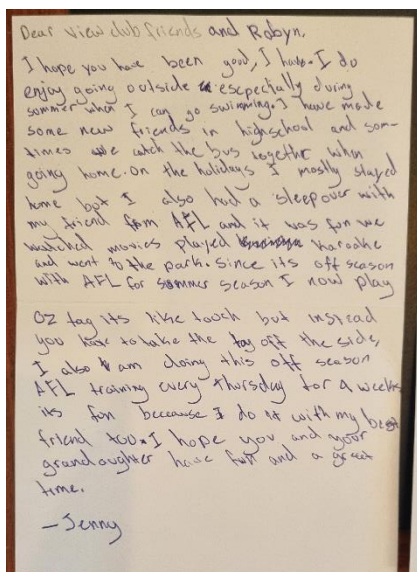
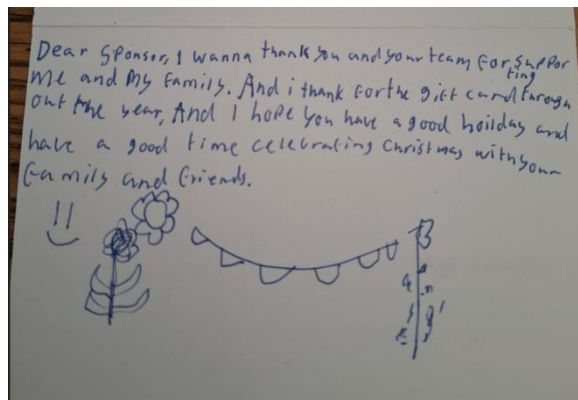
CLUB NEWS

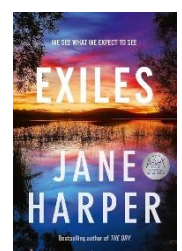

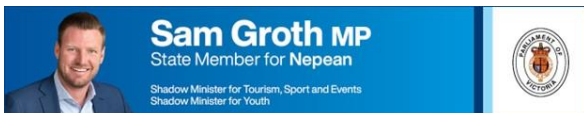
