- Ensure that the content of your motion/s explains and supports your arguments.

Gambling Advertising Bans – Submission

Since 2011 there have been 16 submissions from VIEW Clubs in relation to banning Online Gambling advertisements and advertisements during sporting shows in between TV programs, etc.

In 2022-23 VIEW received several submissions on this topic from a number of VIEW Clubs. It became one of our resolutions and was debated last year at National Convention in Hobart.

In August the VIEW National Executive sent a letter to Minister of Communications the Hon Michelle Rowlands and Prime Minister The Hon. Mr Anthony Albanese in support of the reduction and banning of Gambling Advertising.

Community Grants

National President Elizabeth Birch spoke to a paper circulated prior to the meeting.

VIEW Clubs are reminded that Community Grants are available, and applications can be made for various reasons including;

- promotional events encouraging local women to join VIEW
- · venue hire
- purchasing equipment for use at your Club e.g. microphones, laptop computers, banners, etc.

The Grants Subcommittee keep an updated list of available Grants and can be contacted by emailing june3@iinet.net.au or phoning June - 0412 617 085. Clubs are also advised to look out for any local Community Grants.

When applying for a Grant using The Smith Family as the auspicing organisation please ensure the amount is at least \$1,000. Clubs may like to include items such as a Square Reader and mobile phone, in order to meet that amount. Consider that often smaller funding amounts can be obtained from other organisations without being auspiced e.g. local Football Clubs.

Clubs are reminded that

- Initial approval for any grant needs to be sought from National Office, allowing at least 10 working days for the application to be reviewed and approved. Information on the process can be found in the Club Handbook 2024-25 page 21. which is located on the VIEW Website view.org.au https://www.thesmithfamily.com.au/-/media/files/view-clubs/resources/organisationalinformation/handbooks-and-quidelines/club-handbook-2024-25---final.pdf.
- Venue Hire can also qualify for a Grant. Therefore, if your Club is currently paying for room hire, please consider approaching the venue to waiver the cost. The Room Hire Waiver Request form is available on the VIEW website www.thesmithfamily.com.au/view-clubs/resources/forms.
- Federal Government Volunteer Grants are processed through your Area's Local Member for Parliament, please contact your Local member for more information.

Clubs promoting VIEW to their communities:

Congratulations to all clubs for their support with promoting VIEW to local communities during the last 4 months: Clubs, committees, members and visitors have enjoyed a range of events and fundraising social gatherings.

'Walk with VIEW'- Members from 8 VIEW Clubs in Area QC Gold Coast and Darling Downs recently enjoyed their walk at the Gold Coast Botanical Gardens, dressed in purple promoting VIEW and raising funds for their sponsored students.

Local Businesses supporting local clubs – Many VIEW Clubs have made contact with their local Bunnings (or in some areas Mitre 10) stores holding successful 'sausage sizzles' or home baked goodies tables. They have also been able to promote VIEW utilising Club Banners and Posters and handed out brochures to interested members of the public.



National Manager VIEW Maryanne Maher spoke to a paper circulated prior the meeting.

VIEW Geographical Boundaries review project

Commencing in April – VIEW Geographic Boundaries Project Teams were established in all Areas. Project Team Leaders (and in some instances project team members) were briefed via Microsoft teams where they were taken through their Specific Areas:

- Geographic Boundaries Project Plan and Project Brief
- Statistics, and current mapping and
- Club health survey and Development update (May 2024)

Project Team Leaders were also provided with seven (7) project templates (Area information, local ABS statistics, contact details for local councils, setting up meeting dates/locations etc). for completion.

Project Team leaders arranged meeting/s with the Project Team members, discussed and allocated tasks required and arranged catch up meetings.

Project Teams engaged with Clubs and members in different ways. Some distributed a survey to clubs and then reviewed and recorded responses. Other Project Teams spoke to committee members or held meetings for members to attend.

During May - October 2024 National Manager Maryanne Maher and VIEW Executive developed a travel schedule to connect with members in Areas where there is currently no National Council representation including Regional Areas. The Executive also took the opportunity to host "Meet and Greets" in some Areas either before or after other significant events they were attending eg Area Galas, etc.

Regional Connections

August

 Area NH Central West - (Dubbo, Parkes and Orange) – Meetings were hosted with VIEW members from 9 of the 11 Clubs in the Area. While in Dubbo they met with Rusan Hill Community Development Officer, at Dubbo Regional Council, and The Smith Family Team. Parkes, Forbes and Eugowra Club members came together in Parkes for an informative Meet and Greet. In Orange after a conversation with Allan Reeder Communications Lead, Orange City Council, Orange VIEW Club members received an invitation to attend the annual "Welcome to Orange Lunch". to share information and promote VIEW with people who have moved to Orange in the last 12 months.

Completed Area templates and recommendations have been received from the following Areas: AA, NB, NJ, NK, NL, QA, QB and VA/VB/VC.

Geographic Boundaries Teams Working Group

Working as separate teams the VIEW National Executive and Future of VIEW Working Group (FoVWG) are reviewing the completed Geographic Boundaries Teams information, suggestions and recommendations.

Once all Geographic Boundaries Project teams have returned their documents the Working Group will come together to discuss recommendations and final recommendations to National Leadership Team – in 2025.

WA Leadership Representation on NLT

National President Elizabeth Birch National Manager VIEW Maryanne Maher and presented a paper with National Leadership Team which is summarized below:

In February 2023 Heather Barton AM, Consultant, reported to National Council and Advisors on the VIEW Governance and Leadership Project.

National Representation of all States

We all see the need to make changes to reach a more representative and strong governance structure, which is the reason VIEW is embarking on the Geographic Boundaries project and seeking input and assistance from project teams in each Area.

This comprehensive review of all geographical boundaries of individual Areas is also looking to ensure equity in the work of Zone Councillors within the individual Areas. This comprehensive review will feed into the overall recommendations and the governance structure of the future.

Historical context

National Council and the National Leadership Team is made up of representatives from 20 VIEW Areas. VIEW formed in NSW 1960s, 1970's in ACT, 1980's in Victoria, & Queensland and 1990's South Australia.

The States and Territories that do not have National Council representation on National Leadership Team are:

- VIEW WA formed in 2001
- VIEW Tasmania formed in 2011
- VIEW formed in Palmerston & Darwin NT in 2009 which has since closed
- There are also 6 Areas that currently do not have National Council representation or in some circumstances a Zone Councillor either.

When discussed and debated by National Council in February 2023, the National Leadership Team agreed to hold over any decisions based on representation at National Leadership Team until after the thorough and comprehensive review of all Geographical Boundaries of all VIEW Areas was completed.

The Geographical Boundaries Project was to include a review of how best VIEW members in WA and Tasmania can be represented equitably at the national Decision-making level of VIEW

WA Geographic Boundaries Project Team (and Tasmanian members) have been briefed and included in the Geographic Boundaries project and we look forward to receiving and reviewing their completed templates and recommendations.

National President mentorship

WA, Tas and several other Areas that do not have representation at National Leadership Team are mentored by VIEW National President.

WA VIEW Zone Councillor and members have always been provided with strong attentive mentorship from each VIEW National President who have taken a keen interest in WA leadership, members, club activities, events and issues, and provided extensive support, training and advice and continue to do so.

Reasons why WA doesn't have representation on NLT?

WA does not currently meet the national criteria enabling it to have a VIEW National Councillor – A National Councilor represents an Area. An Area consists of minimum of two Zones - A Zone consists of (7-10) VIEW Clubs.

WA currently has 8 VIEW Clubs, one Zone and therefore does not meet the criteria for two Zones.

Reasons for considering WA leadership Representation on NLT

VIEW established in WA in 2001 (the same year that The Smith Family commenced in WA) and has a strong connection with The Smith Family in WA. There has been recent development (July) of an eighth VIEW Club, and the potential for other VIEW Clubs in the near future. WA Zone Councillor Mary Deakin and WA Development Team are working on developing more clubs in Bunbury, Margaret River, Mandurah, etc.

WA VIEW has over 500 members and currently support 99 students on the *Learning for Life* program.

National Executive believe it is fair and equitable to provide the State of WA with representation on National Leadership Team in 2025 (mid-term) and have been working towards this.

Create mid-term WA representative to NLT

After lengthy communications with WA members, and WA Senior Officers, the National Executive propose an equitable interim solution prior to the Geographic Boundaries review and recommendations to National Leadership Team, is to invite a WA representative to join the National Leadership Team mid-term in 2025.

Eligibility to become a National Councillor - Any member who has had 2 years of experience as a Zone Councillor is eligible to become a National Councillor.

WA Zone Councillor Mary Deakin has indicated that she would like to continue as Zone Councillor for 2025 and continue working to develop VIEW together with the WA development team and step up to the National Leadership Team in 2026-27 term.

Past Zone Councillor Kris Behets is the only other eligible WA VIEW leader currently prepared to take on the interim National Councillor role at National Leadership Team for 2025.

This interim National Councillor position creates another position on the WA leadership team and paves the way for a WA representation at the National Leadership Team in the future. This ultimately will be dependent on the Geographic Boundaries project recommendations and the governance structure of the future.

Proposal:

The National Executive recommend that the National Council agree to create an interim mid-term WA representative position on National Leadership Team in 2025, prior to receiving the recommendations from the Geographic boundaries review, which will bring about structural change to the number of Zone and National Councillor and Leadership roles as well as devise a method to equitably represent VIEW members in all States and Territories at the national decision-making level of VIEW.

Recommendation:

After discussion, the National Leadership Team agreed to the proposal that WA Past Zone Councillor Kris Behets be invited to be the interim mid-term WA National Councillor to the National Leadership Team in 2025.

22 Carried Unanimously Operations Coordinator Christine Costello spoke to a summary report provided 5.5 by Ben Watkinson former Smith Family Company Secretary, now Consultant, Annual Audit – who conducted the internal VIEW Audit 2023. He provided a short list of recommendations for VIEW Club's to adopt for 2024 and into the future. **Outcomes** These recommendations have been shared with Clubs and Councillors together with letters on the outcome of the audit. Councillors have been provided a short presentation they can share with their clubs. Office Coordinator spoke to a paper circulated prior the meeting. 5.6 Contact with Local/State/Federal Representatives **MP Letters** During 2024 National Councillors have continued to profile VIEW in their communities by making contact with the Local, State and Federal Representatives. Discussion has covered topics such as: Suggestions from representatives of ways to promote VIEW in their community; Posting by Representative on Facebook/Website/Newsletter/Flyer: Grants that can help VIEW Clubs and/or support The Smith Family Suggested holding information tables at local shopping centre **Results** National Councillors have reported their current successes back to National

National Councillors have reported their current successes back to National Council. National Councillors will continue to contact their local MPs during 2025 and report back.

There were three Statements of Support about VIEW Clubs read by MPs in Federal and State Parliaments, the most recent was 10 October 2024 in the House of Representatives, The Hon Dan Tehan Member for Wannon acknowledged <u>Hamilton VIEW Club</u> members and thanked them for what they do on behalf of our community. State Parliament Victoria - John Mullahy Member for Glen Waverley on 13 August 2024 congratulated <u>Waverley VIEW Club</u> on their upcoming 40th birthday. New South Wales Parliament - Judy Hannon Member for Wollondilly on 4 June 2024 advised she had recently met with members of the <u>Picton VIEW Club</u>.

National Councillors are reminded that if elections have been recently held in their State eg QLD, MP changes need to be notified to National Office.

Jo Booth, The Smith Family Relationship Manager for Officeworks spoke to National Leadership Team. This follows on from the presentation she gave at June meeting.

She took the National Councillors through the draft guidelines and online process in relation to VIEW, The Smith Family and Officeworks.

It was agreed that as Officeworks are about to enter the busy Christmas period followed by their support of The Smith Family Back to School appeal in February, the VIEW and Officeworks online process will begin in April and trialled through to July 2025.

More information will be provided to clubs early next year.
