andra, Lorraine and I are extremely proud of every VIEW Club. We are so excited to lead this wonderful organisation for the next two years, building on previous work to continue to see VIEW grow, strengthen and develop to ensure it remains the strong organisation it is today.

VIEW accomplished some significant achievements in this time, most notably:

Message from The Smith Family

Thank you to all VIEW members across Australia for everything you do to help Australian children experiencing disadvantage with their education. Your support means these students can have everything they need for the school year.

n our most recent survey of families we support, nearly nine out of 10 respondents told us they are worried to some degree about being able to afford all the things their children will need for school in 2024. With the cost of food, petrol and household items rising, school essentials such as uniforms, books, a laptop and the internet are becoming increasingly hard for families to afford.

In this economic climate, VIEW's sponsorship of more than 1,730 Learning for Life students is crucial - we are so grateful for this longterm and valued partnership. With your incredible fundraising efforts, I am sure the next target of 1,800 students is well within your reach.

The beginning of the year has been a busy time. It was my pleasure to meet VIEW's National Executive 2024-25 at their induction in January, and then to meet the

wider VIEW National Leadership Team in February. Both occasions provided the opportunity to thank VIEW members for your amazing contributions in 2023, which included donating more than \$250,000 towards our Digital Learning Essentials (DLE) program. Around half of our survey respondents said they think their children are likely to miss out on the digital devices needed for their schoolwork because they won't be able to afford them. Your contributions towards the DLE program are so important. Please keep up the amazing fundraisina work!

I also want to call out the collective power of VIEW's 14,000-strong national voice. As champions of our belief that 'education is one of the most powerful change agents', VIEW members have such an important role to play in helping more Australians understand the importance of overcoming educational inequality caused by poverty. With the next National

School Reform Agreement between the Federal Government and the States and Territories due to be finalised this year, I know VIEW Clubs will join The Smith Family in urging our Education Ministers to put in place a system that gives all students the best chance to succeed at school.

I am also excited about the development work happening across VIEW to ensure the organisation can continue for many years to come. The important governance work, as well as the investigations underway to review the geographic boundaries of Areas, Zones and Clubs, are sure to uncover some amazing opportunities and recommendations. I can't wait to hear updates on the progress you are making.

Once again, thank you for being part of VIEW and for making our work possible. Your support is ensuring more young people can get the education support they need to unlock a better future for themselves.





Family's programs for young people in need.



Learn about the important development work we're doing to secure a sustainable future for VIEW. For more than 60 years, VIEW has been a special place for women for all ages and backgrounds to come together for fun and friendship, connected by the shared goal of supporting the work of The Smith Family.

While VIEW continues to make a significant contribution to The Smith Family through volunteering, fundraising, sponsorships and advocacy work, like many volunteer organisations, membership is on the decline, and there is a shortage of leaders.

Recognising the importance of an active leadership group, in February 2023 the VIEW National Council agreed on measures to secure a strong future for VIEW, including a review of the organisation's geographic boundaries.

What is the Geographic Boundaries project?

The Geographical Boundaries project aims to strengthen the governance and leadership structure of VIEW to benefit all members.

To achieve this, several key objectives have been agreed, including reviewing the location and distance between clubs to better understand VIEW's geographic boundaries and ensure equity of workload, sustainability and attractiveness of leadership roles. The project will also explore ways to bolster members' leadership skills by providing more learning opportunities and giving members a greater sense of agency. The project will also look at ways to grow awareness of VIEW within local communities through connections with local councils, other community organisations and local businesses.

Who is involved?

The VIEW National Office team is driving the project with support from Maryanne Maher, VIEW National Manager and Leonie Green, The Smith Family's General Manager, State and Territory Operations. The VIEW National Executive is taking a hands-on role engaging with VIEW members in local communities. Teams of 6-8 VIEW members from different clubs will complete research and activities in their geographic areas.

What has happened so far?

The project has commenced in Perth and surrounding areas in Western Australia and in the Macarthur, Southern Highlands, Illawarra and Wollongong, and Lower Mid North Coast regions of New South Wales. With the aim of developing targeted recommendations, project teams are:

- researching historical and current VIEW data for their area,
- and distances between clubs,investigating ways to promote

reviewing their area's boundaries

- and grow VIEW in their area,
 reviewing collaboration with The Smith Family, and
- organising and facilitating meet and greet events.

Next steps

The project will roll-out in all VIEW areas nationwide throughout 2024, with recommendations reviewed by the National Leadership Team in 2025.

VIEW - Inspired Inclusion on IWD

It's one of the most popular events on the VIEW calendar – find out how VIEW members celebrated International Women's Day (IWD) this year! This year's IWD theme was "Inspire Inclusion". Across Australia VIEW members heard from a myriad of speakers while welcoming guests and other women's groups to join in celebrating IWD and collectively forging a more inclusive world for women.

Western Australia

Two significant VIEW IWD events were held in Perth. West Coast VIEW Club hosted guests at the Currambine Bar and Bistro. The star of the afternoon was Michael, a *Learning for Life* graduate who spoke about his childhood growing up in a single parent household and being supported by The Smith Family through high school and university (see more on page 9). The 100 guests at this event also heard from



VIEW National President, Elizabeth Birch who presented the VIEW IWD speech, and Squadron Leader Sue Freeman, Royal Australian Airforce who talked about her drive to succeed as a fighter pilot in a male-dominated profession.

First WAVE VIEW Club hosted their annual IWD event in the beautiful waterfront venue Marmion Angling & Aquatic Club with 120 VIEW women and their friends.



The Hon. Ayor Makur Chuot MLC Member for North Metropolitan region was the keynote speaker. Ms Chuot and her family came to Australia as refugees from South Sudan. Arriving with no English, Ms Chuot became an accountant, fashion model, interpreter, restaurant owner, mother of three and now Member of the WA Parliament. Captivating the room with her story, Ms Chuot was an inspiration to all.



South Australia

There were several IWD celebrations hosted by VIEW Clubs in and around Adelaide, including a wonderful breakfast presented by Victor Harbor VIEW Club and David Basham MP, Member for Finniss. The event combined IWD with the 2024 Fleurieu Women's Community Awards. SA Past Co-National Councillor Pauline Glover was the host for event with quest speaker Lainie Anderson.

Several members also represented VIEW at the Adelaide International Women's Day Breakfast supporting UN Women Australia. This is the largest event celebrating IWD in Australia and the largest annual women's event in Adelaide. This year, 3,067 attendees were enthralled by Senator Penny Wong as MC, quest speaker Annabel Crabb and Senator Linda Burney.

Queensland

VIEW members across Queensland enjoyed various activities to mark the occasion, while also raising funds. Kenmore VIEW Club hosted a lovely event at Bellbowrie Tavern for members and friends, with lucky door prizes and raffles. Professor Halina Rubinsztein-Dunlop AO FAA (right) from the University of Queensland was a fabulous quest

speaker, translating the complex world of laser micro manipulation into language and concepts all guests could understand! VIEW members Rosemary and Judy also shared their experiences in the world of work.

Michael Learning for Life student

The Smith Family came into Michael's life when he was in late primary school and supported him through high school and now university. Michael grew up in a single parent household with his father who shielded him from the reality of the family's financial position. It wasn't until he received support from The Smith Family that Michael realised his situation.

"I finally had a pair of shoes that fitted me properly and pants without holes. I hadn't realised we were poor!"

Victoria

Over 100 VIEW women from 17 clubs in the South East of Victoria came together at the Dandenong Club. Special guests included Anton Leschen, General Manager Victoria for The Smith Family and Susan Bower, a former nurse and television producer and writer who gave an inspiring account of her careers. Guests also heard from Danyal, a Learning for Life graduate who succeeded in reaching university

thanks to support from The Smith Family. Danyal is now pursuing a degree in aeronautical science, maths and commerce. Members from Bairnsdale VIEW Club (right) also entertained guests singing songs celebrating women, including, "I am Woman."

New South Wales

Gloucester Evening VIEW Club hosted a morning tea for their members and the local community with Trudy Schultz, 2023 Upper Hunter Woman of the Year, as guest speaker. Attendees enjoyed a delicious morning tea of slices, biscuits, pikelets and sandwiches all baked and prepared by VIEW members.

In the Central West, Bathurst VIEW Club (left) co-hosted an afternoon tea for community members, with Andrew Gee MP in attendance and Rachael Brooking,

Orange Citizen of the year as guest spea<u>ker.</u> Organised jointly with VIVAbility of Bathurst, the event was a fantastic opportunity for VIEW to promote its work and connection with The Smith Family to a wider audience.

Around 70 VIEW members in and around the Tamworth area came together at The Pub for an inspirational event hosted by Tamworth Evening VIEW Club. In addition to guest speaker, Lucy Gallagher, attendees also heard from Cindy Pearce, The Smith Family's Programs Coordinator and Kimberley, a mother of two students sponsored through The Smith Family's Learning for Life program.

At the IWD event hosted by Harrington Evening VIEW Club, three inspirational young students from the local public school gave a presentation about the history of IWD and were put in the 'hot seat' answering questions about their role models and inspiring celebrities.

The committee organised two wonderful quest speakers, Luce Trease, Ballina Shire Young Citizen of the Year and Sarah Kennady, Momentum Collective, Domestic Violence Care Manager. The young women helped to create a wonderful atmosphere of positivity and possibility in the room.

The VIEW IWD Speech was presented by members of the VIEW National Leadership Team at events across the country. The speech referenced the much-loved Matilda's, Australia's national women's soccer team, and joint Australian of the Year winner, Professor Georgina Long, as great examples of inspirational women making a difference.



Michael is grateful for all the support he has received from The Smith Family. The Tertiary Scholarship has helped him to purchase textbooks and a laptop, as well as cover travel costs for exams, internet access and other essentials he has needed. Without this support, Michael says he could not have followed his passion to complete his Bachelor's Degree in Computer Science. He is currently completing his Masters in Computer Science and working towards becoming a software engineer.

Member stories

Coleen's childhood connection to **The Smith Family**

Coleen is the President of Bundaberg VIEW Club in Central Queensland, which opened in 2022. Coleen has a rich history with VIEW and The Smith Family.

It was the 1950s, and Coleen was just five years old with two young siblings and more on the way. Her mother was caring for the family, while they were living with arandparents as they waited for housing. It was such a difficult time - then The Smith Family entered their lives.

"They gave us food hampers, clothing and financial assistance," Coleen recalls. "We never felt 'lessthan'; the caring people from The Smith Family made sure of that."

Coleen never forgot that interaction, and decades later, The Smith Family re-entered her life. She'd moved to northern NSW with her husband Michael and was invited to visit her

local VIEW Club. Someone there mentioned VIEW's connection to The Smith Family. This sparked Coleen's curiosity, and she learnt that The Smith Family was now focused on supporting the education of children living with disadvantage.

Coleen was delighted to learn that VIEW's 14,000 members around Australia share a common goal: to support the work of The Smith Family. "I joined that night and found my purpose," says Coleen. "Children are our future. To support children on their education journey is paramount."

In 2021, Coleen and Michael retired to Lowmead, a small, rural town in Queensland. With no local VIEW Club, Coleen, with help from an experienced member of the VIEW National Leadership Team, Jean Jennings, set to work to start one. Within six months Bundaberg VIEW Club was formed, with Coleen as President. The Club's 45 members worked hard to make connections in their community and have now raised enough funds to sponsor four students on The Smith

Family's Learning for Life program.



After a lifetime connected to The Smith Family, Coleen can't think of a better way to give back. "The impact The Smith Family had on my life was huge," Coleen says.

"Helping children experience a positive and happy school life is so important. I didn't have all the items I needed in my early years, so I try every day for this to be available to the children Bundaberg VIEW Club sponsors."

Now Coleen is helping lay the groundwork for a new VIEW Club in another Oueensland community. "Every child deserves the best education and the items and tools for them to grow, dream and prosper," she says. "My heart is full re-living my Smith Family journey and the joy of VIEW."

Marie's experience at Learning Club

Marie joined Tonsley VIEW Club (SA) in October 2021. After learning about The Smith Family's Learning Clubs in 2022, Marie became a Learning Club volunteer in February 2023. Having enjoyed the opportunity so much, she's signed up again in 2024! Read about why she loves her volunteering role.

Program case study: Saver Plus

Saver Plus is a free financial education and matched savings program developed by ANZ and the Brotherhood of St Laurence. It is delivered in partnership with The Smith Family and Berry Street, with funding from **ANZ and Department of Social Services.**

How Saver Plus works

Saver Plus rewards regular saving by participants and builds lifelong money-saving habits. At the start of the program, participants set a savings goal and complete financial education workshops to learn about saving money.

Participants who save regularly for 10 months can receive up to \$500 extra from ANZ in their bank account. The money can be spent on education expenses such as books, laptops, uniforms and extracurricular activities like sports or music.

during the program, 87 percent of participants continue to save for at least 3 – 7 years after completing the program.

Caring for a young child can be demanding, especially when taking on that role later in life. For Johanna*, raising her granddaughter Edie* posed physical and mental challenges and added financial strain.

Johanna joined the Saver Plus program to prepare for Edie's start at school the following year. MoneyMinded workshops, part of Saver Plus, reminded her of money-saving skills she already knew. She also learnt new tips and tricks to help her save.



"I love interacting with the children. It's certainly not an onerous activity. The children can be a little challenging but overall, it is a very rewarding experience - hopefully for them, as well as me.

"A class begins with an Acknowledgement to Country, usually followed by reading to the younger ones or listening to the older children. Then we do an activity which could be learning

games, depending on the age and level of learning. We finish with afternoon tea before they are collected by their caregivers. Each week is a little different. Claire, the facilitator, is amazing. She comes up with different activities to keep the children engaged.

"Learning Club has given me a different perspective of learning with the children. It has introduced me to the type of children our VIEW


