

About Future Seekers Secondary

Future Seekers Secondary provides early exposure to students in Years 7 and 8 about the world of work through an imaginative and interactive approach to career-related learning.

How does the program work?

Future Seekers Secondary is run by a trained facilitator from The Smith Family. During class time, students participate in 60-minute in school sessions each week for 6 or 7 weeks.

During the program students will:

- Learn about soft skills, such as communication, creativity, critical thinking, citizenship, collaboration, and character.
- Start to think about their own skills and interests and how these might be helpful in imaginative and real-world scenarios.
- Work in groups to consider a community issue and the people and skills that might support a solution to the issue.
- Through reflection and a growth mindset, explore different practices in workplaces.

Future Seekers Secondary aims to help students by:

- Increase opportunities for students to have positive exposure to, and engage in informed conversations about skills, self-identity, and work.
- Increasing their awareness of the world of world of work and what skills they have already that will help them in their future.



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
